

Clifton Gorge State Nature Preserve

his 268-acre preserve protects one of the most spectacular dolomite and limestone gorges in the state. Registered as a National Natural Landmark in 1968, Clifton Gorge encompasses a 2-mile stretch of the Little Miami State and National Scenic River, just east of John Bryan State Park.

Geologically, it is an outstanding example of interglacial and postglacial canyon cutting. At one point, the river funnels through a deep, narrow channel, which was apparently formed by the enlarging and connecting of a series of potholes in the resistant Silurian dolomite bedrock. In other sections of the gorge, cliff overhangs have broken off forming massive slump blocks scattered along the valley floor.

The shaded, north-facing slopes provide a cool, moist environment for northern species including hemlock, red baneberry, Canada yew, arbor-vitae and mountain maple. This is one of the most spectacular sites in the state for viewing spring wildflowers including the rare snow trillium.



Historic Clifton

The area had settlers in the early 1800's with many taking advantage of the river and cliffs to establish water powered mills. When Clifton Mill was first built it was believed to be the largest mill in the country due to the six levels.

According to Broadstone's History, "The town of Clifton is the oldest town in Miami Township, dating its official beginning from 1833." The county surveyor was Robert Walton and he plotted 32 lots for Bates & Lewis. The plat was registered on 24 August 1833.

The Village of Clifton is divided by the Clark and Greene County line. The division originates in 1818 when Clark County is established. This division even continues through the local Clifton Union Cemetery. The first burials in this cemetery are about 1813/1814.

Famous Clifton Connections

Isaac Funk, of Funk & Wagnalls Fame, was born in Clifton on 10th September 1859. He later moved to Springfield where he graduated from

Wittenberg in 1860 and was ordained a Lutheran Pastor. He is best known for "Standard Encyclopedia of World's Knowledge," produced by his partnership with Adam Wagnalls in 1877. Isaac Funk died 4 April 1912, in New Jersey but is buried in Brooklyn, New York.²

David Talbot Littler was born in Clifton on 7 February 1836. He was a lawyer and politician serving in several roles. He moved to Illinois, where he served as a Justice of the Peace, and in the House of Representatives as well as in the Senate. He died in Illinois on 23 June 1902 and is buried in Springfield, Illinois.³

Benjamin Whiteman was born in Pennsylvania but is famous for having moved the county line so that his Clifton home would remain in Greene County rather than Clark County. This home stands just east of Clifton on North River Road and is listed on the National Register of Historic Places with an approximate date of 1805. Whiteman moved to

the Clifton area about that time with his father-in-law Owen Davis. He also served in the military in several campaigns. Benjamin Whiteman died 1 July 1852 and is buried in nearby Clifton Union Cemetery.

Owen Davis was the father-inlaw of Benjamin Whiteman. He is listed as registering, "Jonathan a negro boy aged nine years on the 1st day of September 1805." This registration was done with the Clerk of Court of the Common Pleas Court of Greene County and is housed at the Greene County Archives. We do not know any other information about Jonathan, but this was most likely to be compliant with the Ohio Black codes passed in 1804. Owen Davis stayed in the Clifton area and was highly active in the county contributing to the first courthouse, building a mill, and settling at a time when battles were still going on in what was considered a frontier area. Owen Davis died on 18 February 1818 and is buried in Clifton Union Cemetery.



The Clifton Opera House

5 Clay Street, Clifton OH

ike many thriving small towns of the day, Clifton built an Opera House in 1893. The building's architect, Charles Cregar, having recently completed the Springfield City Building and Market, was the preeminent Victorian architect of the Springfield area until his untimely death three years later at the age of thirty-eight.

The Opera House has been used as a concert hall and theater and has also served as a community auditorium for town meetings, school activities, and all manner of gatherings. In 1978, Howard Printz, President of the Clifton Historical Society of that time, began raising funds to save the deteriorating building. The Opera House was restored and has held performances ever since. The venue seats a little over two hundred people including some original seats in the balcony. The acoustics are such that a low voice from the stage can be heard

in the back rows. The Opera House today features live music each week from Spring through Christmas, with styles ranging from Bluegrass to Celtic. School musicals and other performing arts events are also booked, as well as private soirees on occasion. Food trucks have also regularly been on hand to offer dining options for a picnic in the park or carry-in during Opera House shows.

The Opera House building is owned and operated by the Village government their network of generous volunteers. Notably, Council member Paula Lazorski and the Village's Clerk/ Treasurer, Sue Chasnov have been at the helm to keep the vibrant theater venue part of the fabric of the Clifton community. 
