

HIKE THE **Clifton Gorge**

Saturday, August 23, 2025, 10 AM- 11:30 AM

Please join the Division of Natural Areas and Preserves staff for a guided hike at Clifton Gorge State Nature Preserve. This down and back hike will begin in the preserve parking lot on Jackson Street in Clifton and will traverse the .6-mile Narrow's Trail to the newly renovated Exploration Center.

Please meet in the parking lot at 10:00 AM.



Clifton Gorge State Nature Preserve

This 268-acre preserve protects one of the most spectacular dolomite and limestone gorges in the state. Registered as a National Natural Landmark in 1968, Clifton Gorge encompasses a 2-mile stretch of the Little Miami State and National Scenic River, just east of John Bryan State Park.

Geologically, it is an outstanding example of interglacial and post-glacial canyon cutting. At one point, the river funnels through a deep, narrow channel, which was apparently formed by the enlarging

and connecting of a series of potholes in the resistant Silurian dolomite bedrock. In other sections of the gorge, cliff overhangs have broken off forming massive slump blocks scattered along the valley floor.

The shaded, north-facing slopes provide a cool, moist environment for northern species including hemlock, red baneberry, Canada yew, arbor-vitae and mountain maple. This is one of the most spectacular sites in the state for viewing spring wildflowers including the rare snow trillium.

Clifton's Renovation Journey



In the spring of 2024, we received a phone call from a gentleman who stated he was interested in historic Ohio theaters and would like to tour The Clifton Opera House. We met at the opera house which he found fascinating, he was quite impressed that the opera house kept a full schedule of live music from February till December every Saturday night and along with a free public jam session for musicians on Friday nights. Many any opera houses in small towns were demolished due to the cost of upkeep and being in direct competition with larger music venues.

The Clifton Opera House was built in 1893 by Charles Creager, a well known architect in the Springfield area. It has served as an opera house, a community meeting hall, a graduation hall for the Clifton Union School,

gymnasium, and village offices. In 1987, the north wall of the opera house collapsed and the building was to be torn down. A grass roots effort from the residents of the village and surrounding area, raised enough funds to repair the structure. The Clifton Opera House has now come full circle to again as a venue for live music, school plays and a community room. Owned by the Village of Clifton, it is managed and maintained by a very devoted group of volunteers. This group does all the scheduling of the bands and activities in the opera house. Even the one of a kind hand painted mural backdrop depicting the historic buildings in Clifton, was completed by the local painter Sharon Benedict. The very devoted group of volunteers show up every weekend to work the door, the concessions,

the cleaning, the scheduling and contracting of bands. The village wants to keep what has always been a vital part of our small community, alive and functional. Even with the holes in the floor, the flooding of the basement when it rains, non potable water, bats in the attic, and numerous other problems that occur in an old 132 year old historic building, are repaired by volunteers donating time and supplies. It became obvious that The Clifton Opera House was a labor of love for the village.

We continued the tour to the village with lunch at The Historic Clifton Mill. The owner, Tony Satariano, had a chance to sit with us and share some of his memories of the opera house. We shared many stories of what makes Clifton a special place to live.

Fast forward to the part that was unknown at the time of the visit... An Ohio Capital Bill was passed in the Ohio House and Senate earlier in the year to take the overage of 2023 funds of the state and return them back to the Ohio taxpayers to fund multiple community and regional projects. The "One Time Strategic Community Investment Fund" (OTSCIF) had approximately 700 million dollars that would be used for a variety of regional and local community projects. The projects in the individual counties can be found on the Ohiohouse.gov website. The gentleman who had been interested in the tour of the opera house had been scouting for Governor Michael Dewine to identify projects in communities that would qualify to receive some of these funds.

The village then received a phone

call from the Governor explaining that Clifton could possibly be a recipient of some monies available and ask for a visit to tour the historic opera house and schoolhouse and what our "wish list" would be. We had one ready for him upon arrival!

Later that year, we were thrilled to learn that the opera house and the schoolhouse would be on the list to receive monies for repairs that the village of approximately 150 people, would never be able to afford. The Clifton Opera House will receive 1.9 million dollars and The Clifton Union Public School will receive 3.9 million dollars.

The project is scheduled to be completed in the next two years with an end date given of December of 2026.

The improvements that will take place in the opera house will be significant. The building will be stabilized structurally. It will be brought up to current state ADA regulations with new ramps, lifts, and an elevator to the balcony. There will be new heating/air, new electric/furnace and air, new sound/lighting/AV equipment, and new painting, and curtains. Windows will be updated or replaced. Kitchen improvements, new seats that will be wider and softer, more bathrooms, improvements to the rooms in the basements (green rooms) and a new well.

All these improvements to make your experience at The Clifton Opera House more comfortable and enjoyable so the crowds to see the performances will keep growing.

The Clifton Union School was



constructed in 1872-1873 and consisted of four classrooms. The students received a 12 year education, with the first class of 5 students graduating in 1878. The school building spans both Greene and Clark Counties and an "X" is carved into the stone molding on both sides of the building marking the county line. The bell tower and roof were repair after storm damage in the late 1800's and the north addition was added in the early 1900's. The father of Woody Hayes was superintendent at the school from 1911-1916, during that time "Woody" was born in Clifton. In 1955 the The Clifton Union School merged with Cedarville creating the Cedar-Cliff School District and only the elementary was kept in Clifton. Then in 1962 the decision was made to close the school permanently. The school was sold several times and used as a storage building, and grain storage until the Village of Clifton purchased the building back.

The improvements to the school house, due to the size of the building, will be more structural. Hazmat crews will remove asbestos and bat droppings, removal of lead paint, old carpets and tiles. The roof will be fixed, new electric, new furnace/air, ADA ramps, and new bathrooms. The improvements will keep this wonderful building "standing strong for another hundred years." This will allow the building to be utilized in a functional manner and will help the Village of Clifton by utilizing the revenue to sustain itself. We are also looking for ideas to utilize this wonderful space so if you have any thoughts or ideas please let the village know.

The Clifton Presbyterian Church has graciously opened their doors to the village to be able to continue the Friday night Bluegrass Jam sessions and each Saturday night there will be live music with food trucks present. They have even allowed the village to use one of their rooms to hold the village records.

Many changes are happening!

During the next year there will be numerous work crews, trucks, construction noise all around our village. We ask that our neighbors are patient because when this project is completed, The Village of Clifton will have two of its finest and oldest building brought to life again. We thank Governor Michael Dewine and all who have taken their time and energy to make this project a reality. We hope to see you when we reopen the doors to the public to share the grandeur of these buildings.



The Clifton Opera House

5 Clay Street, Clifton OH

Like many thriving small towns of the day, Clifton built an Opera House in 1893. The building's architect, Charles Creager, having recently completed the Springfield City Building and Market, was the preeminent Victorian architect of the Springfield area until his untimely death three years later at the age of thirty-eight.

The Opera House has been used as a concert hall and theater and has also served as a community auditorium for town meetings, school activities, and all manner of gatherings. In 1978, Howard Printz, President of the Clifton Historical Society of that time, began raising funds to save the deteriorating building. The Opera House was restored and has held performances ever since. The venue seats a little over two hundred people including some original seats in the balcony. The acoustics are such that a low voice from the stage can be heard

in the back rows. The Opera House today features live music each week from Spring through Christmas, with styles ranging from Bluegrass to Celtic. School musicals and other performing arts events are also booked, as well as private soirees on occasion. Food trucks have also regularly been on hand to offer dining options for a picnic in the park or carry-in during Opera House shows.

The Opera House building is owned and operated by the Village government and their network of generous volunteers. Notably, Council member Paula Lazorski and the Village's Clerk/Treasurer, Sue Chasnov have been at the helm to keep the vibrant theater venue part of the fabric of the Clifton community.
