Clifton Gorge

State Nature Preserve

This 268-acre preserve protects one of the most spectacular dolomite and limestone gorges in the state. Registered as a National Natural Landmark in 1968, Clifton Gorge encompasses a 2-mile stretch of the Little Miami State and National Scenic River, just east of John Bryan State Park.

Geologically, it is an outstanding example of interglacial and post-glacial canyon cutting. At one point, the river funnels through a deep, narrow channel, which was apparently formed by the enlarging

and connecting of a series of potholes in the resistant Silurian dolomite bedrock. In other sections of the gorge, cliff overhangs have broken off forming massive slump blocks scattered along the valley floor.

The shaded, north-facing slopes provide a cool, moist environment for northern species including hemlock, red baneberry, Canada yew, arbor-vitae and mountain maple. This is one of the most spectacular sites in the state for viewing spring wildflowers including the rare snow trillium.

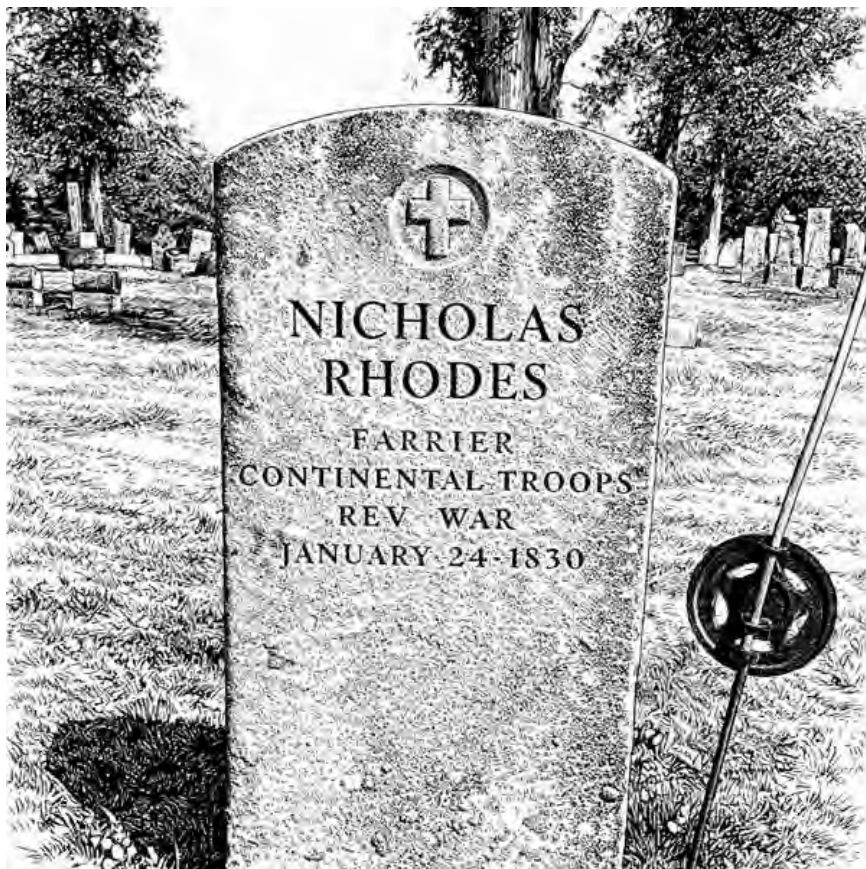
Ethera (Fire Dancers) 8:30-9:00 PM

Celebrating 250 Years of Liberty in Clifton, Ohio



The America 250 celebration pulls our thoughts to the east coast and the thirteen colonies. Battles and names, such as Lexington and Paul Revere come to mind when thinking of our founding. Ohio and Greene County were founded in 1803, with most of the county within the Virginia Military District. The VMS

(Virginia Military Survey), as it is commonly referred to, was a land payment to veterans or their heirs for military service. The founding of our still very agrarian community was by soldiers turned farmers. They helped to establish our country and county. We do not have to look to the famous or the far away to feel the connection to revolutionary events.

REVOLUTIONARY SOLDIERS IN CLIFTON UNION CEMETERY

Nicholas Rhodes-1761-1830

He served under H. Lee or Lighthorse Lee as a farrier to troops that included an elite guard of General George Washington. He later served as a Dragoon.

Benjamin Whiteman 1759-1852

He is famous for having moved the Greene County line so that his Clifton home would remain in Greene County rather than Clark County. This home stands just east of Clifton on North River Road and is listed on the National Register of Historic Places with an approximate date of 1805. Whiteman's Revolutionary War service is unproven but assumed due to the fact that he had attained the rank of Lt. Colonel by 1805. He was ready to "take up arms" against the British in 1807. He served during the War of 1812.

Owen Davis 1751-1818

He emigrated from Wales. Served from Pennsylvania, revolutionary service needs further research.

Thomas Townsley 1755-1841

National Honor Roll number 35519. He was a charter member of the Yellow Springs Presbyterian Church in Clifton. Pensioned in 1832.

Jacob Mills 1770-1850

Volunteered as an associator in Virginia while under the age of sixteen. His father served in the Revolution as well so probably contributed to his motivation. He in later life continued to serve his community as a Justice of Peace.

Thomas Baker 1762-182

Served in the 5th Regiment Pennsylvania Militia and later in the 6th Regiment. A family letter states that he was taken as a prisoner of war and held on a ship off the coast of Ireland. He escaped and with assistance from the Irish hid until the end of the war.

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The Clifton Opera House

5 Clay Street, Clifton OH

Like many thriving small towns of the day, Clifton built an Opera House in 1893. The building's architect, Charles Creager, having recently completed the Springfield City Building and Market, was the preeminent Victorian architect of the Springfield area until his untimely death three years later at the age of thirty-eight.

The Opera House has been used as a concert hall and theater and has also served as a community auditorium for town meetings, school activities, and all manner of gatherings. In 1978, Howard Printz, President of the Clifton Historical Society of that time, began raising funds to save the deteriorating building. The Opera House was restored and has held performances ever since. The venue seats a little over two hundred people including some original seats in the balcony. The acoustics are such that a low voice from the stage can be heard

in the back rows. The Opera House today features live music each week from Spring through Christmas, with styles ranging from Bluegrass to Celtic. School musicals and other performing arts events are also booked, as well as private soirees on occasion. Food trucks have also regularly been on hand to offer dining options for a picnic in the park or carry-in during Opera House shows.

The Opera House building is owned and operated by the Village government and their network of generous volunteers. Notably, Council member Paula Lazorski and the Village's Clerk/Treasurer, Sue Chasnov have been at the helm to keep the vibrant theater venue part of the fabric of the Clifton community.
